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State Dress Code 2010 – 2011 Revised May, 2010

1.1 Scope of NSW WBA Inc Dress Code:

All members of affiliated clubs shall wear regulation State Uniform when playing on any green in NSW WBA controlled matches and competitions.

For social events and playing days the type of dress to be worn by the players is to be the decision made by the Management Committee of each individual Club.

1.2 Measurements for regulation State Uniform:

The following measurements must be adhered to –

Slacks, White / Junior Navy or Coloured - instep length.

Shorts and Culottes, White / Junior Navy or Coloured , must be a minimum knee length*

Pedal Pushers: White / Junior Navy or Coloured must be mid calf length.

Skirt: - White / Junior Navy or colour co-ordinated, minimum knee length*

Suits: - Slacks or Skirts, White / Junior navy.

Dresses: - White only minimum knee length *.

Sleeves: may be long, short or three- quarter length.

Petticoats or half –slips must be worn under frocks and skirts.

* “Knee Length” means when kneeling, shorts touch ground.

All shirts must have a collar

All coloured garments are to be co-ordinated with club shirts and only as approved by the Association.

All garments must be of NON –TRANSPARENT material:

1.3 Logos / Monograms:

- NSW WBA Inc. logos may be used on **some** approved garments.
- Sponsor’s logo (**10cms x 5cms**) on sleeve of wind jacket or shirt, or on the back or left hand side of caps or bucket hats (**9cms X 2 cm**)
- Manufacturer’s logo may be on back of neck of shirt or on sleeve or back of caps or bucket hats. (**9cm x 2cm**)
- Club logo (**9cms x 9cms**) and / or personal name on left front of wind jacket / shirt.
- Club name on back of garment **22.5 cms x 5 cms**.
- BA logo, if worn, is to be on Right front side of garment, unless otherwise approved.

ALL THESE MEASUREMENTS ARE THE MAXIMUM SIZE ALLOWED

1.4 Headwear (optional)

White hats or coloured co-ordinated eyeshade, cap or bucket hat (as approved by the Association) may be worn.

Green lining and width of brim as approved.,

Cancer Council hat style No 4273 is approved.

Knitted Caps/Visors as sold in Bowls Shops are approved. Hand knitted caps/visors not approved.

BA Logo **can only be** on right hand side. (**not compulsory**)

The NSW WBA Inc strongly recommends all members should wear head protection when outdoors.

On special days when there is an **INVITED** Official representative from the Association and / or District, it is at the discretion of the Club President if headwear is to be worn.

1.5 Club name on headwear:

White cotton / polyester band with blue embroidered lettering. For eyeshades and caps – half (1/2) hatband or **club name** directly onto the cap or shade.

Any embroidery on caps/bucket hats to be 10cms x 2 cms.

BA Logo on front of **any** headwear not approved.

1.6 Blazers

Junior navy with or without collar, with State monogram on top left pocket with name of club (optional) and or Interstate (where authorized) under the monogram in gold. Only blazers approved by the Association may be worn.

1.7 Cardigans / Vests:

Cardigans

White / Junior Navy plain knit.

Junior navy (**As supplied by bona fide lawn bowling suppliers**), long sleeve or sleeveless, with a narrow gold and white stripe inside bands. State monogram on left front.

Vest – Plain knit or fleece. White / Junior Navy or Coloured (co-ordinated with club shirt only as approved by the Association).

1.8 Wind Jackets:

White / Junior Navy or Coloured (to match club shirt and only as approved by the Association) with State Monogram on Left front (optional).

1.9 Coloured / white shirts:

Coloured / white shirts to be worn with culottes, skirts, shorts, slacks or pedal pushers.

To be worn with waistband (not tucked in). May have a self fabric band with splits up the side seam or a rib band (4 – 4.5cms) **NOT hem only**.

Shirt to have collar and 3 – 4 buttons in front.

Members / teams of a club MUST all wear the same style, colour and design, if they have a club shirt.

An **undergarment** must not be worn without an overblouse.

Coloured club shirts must be approved by Association.

UMPIRES

SHIRTS AS APPROVED BY THE NSW WBA MUST BE WORN BY QUALIFIED UMPIRES AND MEASURERS WHEN OFFICIATING.

1.10(a) Club Shirt Approval:

Club shirt for approval to be submitted together with photo and details of colour, design and name of manufacturer to NSW WBA uniform committee (**through the District**).

CLUBS MAY HAVE ONE (1) OFFICIAL SHIRT FOR PENNANTS AND DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIPS. ANY OTHER SHIRT TO BE USED FOR SOCIAL DAYS.

1.10(b) District Shirts/Jackets for approval to be submitted together with photo and details of colour, design to NSW WBA uniform committee (**through the District**).

1.11 Compression Garments are permissible and should be as colour-co-ordinated to your club uniform or white garments as possible. **Black under white uniform is not allowed.** Any undergarment worn under a short sleeved overblouse/shirt should be snug fitting in the arms similar to a lycra garment.

The wearing of loose fitting t/shirts and skivvies under short sleeved shirts for added warmth is not allowed. Leg garments may be worn under long pants or shorts. Again colour co-ordinated and **no black under white**.

1.12 Rainwear

White, Junior Navy or Clear material.

1.13 Footwear: - as approved by Bowls Australia

Shoes predominately white, junior navy or colour-co-ordinated with Slacks, Shorts or Pedal Pushers, with smooth flat soles (non slip recommended). **Navy shoes / sandals** may be worn with junior navy garments, but NOT to be worn with white uniform.

1.14 Hosiery: (optional)

Tights or stockings, mini beige shade.

Socks, sockettes or anklets – white.

Socks, sockettes or anklets – navy with navy slacks only.

Long socks only with slacks.

1.15 Handbags:

Only White or junior navy. Preferred.

1.16(a) Badges: (On clothing)

May be worn on the **LEFT** side **ONLY**.

One badge ONLY to be on the **LEFT** collar or lapel, **NONE ON RIGHT**.

Name badge may be worn on left or center front of uniform.

NSW WBA Merit Pin to be above all other badges.

Royal NSWBA Merit Pin to be worn below all other badges.

Club Badges must be worn on left side of uniform. Only club badges as approved by the Association may be worn.

Club Friendship badges may only be worn when playing with the Club from which they were given.

- (b) **Hat Badges** – Badges that may be worn on hats include NSW (Map) Hat Badge, NSW Interstate Bar, Round Robin Shield, Australian Stars, and BA Hat Badge which goes behind any of the above badges. These may be worn on Right hand side of the hat **ONLY**. **Affiliation Badge (optional) centre front.**

BADGES TO BE WORN WITH DISCRETION.

1.17 Dusters:

May be white or coloured.

1.18 Scarves / neckpieces / mittens:

May be white or navy (Coolite collars)

1.19 Wearing of Neat Casual Attire

Is not permitted for Club Championships, President's Days, District and State Fixtures. On Special Days such as Carnivals etc, attire as set down by the Women's Club or Parent Body may be worn.

1.20 Jewellery to be worn with discretion

1.21 Bowling Gloves: Predominately white only.

2.1 State Championships at all Levels and Pennants including Playoffs:

White / Junior Navy / or Coloured garments (as approved by the Association).

ALL TEAM MEMBERS to be dressed in same colour uniform. This does not include vests, jackets, shoes or headwear.

Composite teams competing in the State Carnival, may wear their respective club uniform.

B.A. LOGO MUST BE ON UNIFORM, FOR ALL STATE SANCTIONED EVENTS, FROM JULY 2007 ON RIGHT HAND SIDE OF APPAREL, UNLESS SPECIAL DISPENSATION HAS BEEN GIVEN BY BOWLS AUSTRALIA.

Please NOTE:-

It is the prerogative of the President of each Club to approach any affiliated player while at her club, whom she feels is not appropriately dressed, explaining the contravention of the State Uniform Code of NSW WBA Inc.

All coloured garments are to be co-ordinated with club shirt and only as approved by NSWWBA.
